
Year 9 students had a fantastic time at the

Principal's message......

Term 4 has started exceptionally well with the implementation of YONDR. Delroy is now a mobile phone and other personal digital device free school. Students were issued with a locking pouch for their mobile phones. This means that every mobile phone that is brought to school must be turned off and locked away in the pouch. The pouches are not unlocked until the end of the school day. Any phone that is seen out of the locked pouch will be confiscated and locked in the school's safe. Only parents/carers are able to collect the confiscated phones between 8.00am and 4.00pm. The success of the implementation is reflected in the comments from students, "I am actually concentrating more in class", "We talked about so much stuff at recess",

Observations from staff include noticing more students participating in physical activity, sitting and talking to each other, waiting for their friends to arrive at school and having more conversations with staff in the playground.

Thank you to all of the parents/carers, students and staff for their support of this initiative. We look forward to further success.

ASPIRE night was an excellent night for students to display their creative skills both musically and artistically. Many students performed their year 9/10 assessment tasks as well as other students showing off their skills in circus, singing and the playing of a variety of musical instruments. CAREERS

Late last term 15 students from Delroy Campus attended the Wool Industry Showcase Day hosted by TAFE NSW at their Narromine Road Campus. Students attended workshops in Shearing, Sheep Selection using Sheep Dogs, Wool Classing and Wool Handling. Representatives from The Shearing Contractors Association of Australia spoke to the students about the employment opportunities in Wool Industries whilst they were at school through School Based Traineeships and post school jobs. Students were able to ask lots of questions about working conditions, pay-rates, job security and job flexibility. Presenters highlighted the urgent need for more workers to go into the wool industry to meet the demand of high wool production both in the Dubbo region and in shearing sheds across Australia.

Last Wednesday we had at visit from Defence Force Jobs. Naval personnel, Dave Whiteman and Gordon Hutcheon from the Royal Australian Navy gave an insight into careers in the armed services and the many job roles that are required to protect our country and assist other countries during conflict and disaster.

This term we will be focusing on Work Readiness skills for Year 9. One task/skill to start with is creating a Unique Student Identifier, a number/code required for any training courses e.g. White Card, First-Aid Certificate, Active-Volunteering Certificate.

Your child can create a USI themselves by going to www.usi.gov.au where they will enter details using a form of identification. A personal email address and a mobile phone number will be required (to be used to retrieve USI if password or USI is forgotten). Please note that if a USI has been created using a parent/family email your child will not be able to use this email address to create their USI.

If your child needs assistance in creating a USI the Careers Adviser at Delroy can work through the process with them. They will need to bring a photocopy of their Medicare card **or** Birth Certificate, personal email address and know their mobile phone number. Copies of their USI will be printed and given to students to store at home.

STRIVE Class Scoop....

Year 8 Report:

I can hardly believe that the school year ends in less than two months! Having said that, this term is a very busy one with students completing their final assessments and examinations of their Stage 4 studies. It is important that students apply their best efforts, as their results this term could have an impact on the classes that students are placed in next year.

This term in English, students are looking at <u>The Taming of the Shrew</u> by William Shakespeare. The assessment for this unit of work is due to be presented in class on 18/11/19 (Week 6) and involves a character study. Students are expected to create a collage, and then present this orally to the class, justifying the choices made in representing aspects of the character's personality, standing, traits and development.

Interconnections is our new topic of study in Geography. In this unit, students explore the consequences of global interconnections, now and into the future. Students will compete an examination for their assessment in Week 5, comprising of content drawn from the current topic, as well as Water in the World which was studied last term. The exam comprises of multiple choice questions, skills work and two extended response questions. Students can begin preparing for these two questions as they have received them in their yellow Term 4 Assessment Booklet.

We have begun our new topic in Math's focusing on Circles. This will build upon students' understanding developed within the Area and Volume topic which we have just completed. Students will complete their Semester 2 Examination in Week 7 with questions sourced from Area and Volume, Circles and Geometry. Students will also be required to complete some non-calculator questions. At this point in the year, it is vital that all students have their own personal calculator to use. These can be purchased through the front office. In PDHPE, students are exploring Relationships and Tolerance. This term's assessment comes from their practical work and is ongoing throughout the term.

Finally, we have started a new topic in Science looking at *Microbes*. The assessment for Science is an examination which draws upon work studied throughout the whole year. Last week, students were taught the 'Alphabet Soup' technique for developing revision notes. They are actively encouraged to develop a regular home-revision pattern to equip them for the best success in their upcoming examinations and assessment tasks.

I would also like to thank the team at Woolworths Delroy Park for their continued commitment to the Year 8 Strive class, enabling us to cater afternoon tea for Wednesday Homework Centre on a fortnightly basis. Homework Centre is a great opportunity for students to complete their homework and assessment tasks, while also gaining extra assistance if needed.




