Well done Rylee Warren who competed in the 16 years boys High Jump (1.70m 2019), Rylee matched the current records.

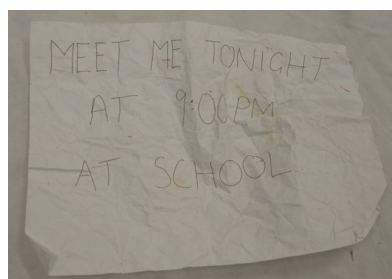
The Western Area Athletics Trials will be held on 2 August (Friday

Welcome to Library and Information Week 2019.

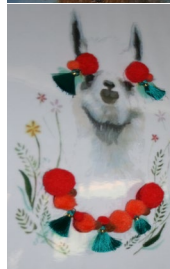
Our library is always a busy place and it definitely has been during NAPLAN testing. Thank you to the staff and students who have persevered with the technology.
